"We are holding this event to bring immediate attention to the Florida KidCare Coalition and to make Florida KidCare enrollment a valuable option for employers and their employees," Rachel Blaasch, community services specialist, spoke with loyalty for the Florida KidCare program.

There are 17 Florida KidCare Coalitions in Florida. The Pasco County Florida KidCare Coalition is available to those in Pasco County.

Highlighted during the roundtable was the importance of healthcare coverage and making parents and business owners aware of its availability and all that it has to offer. During the program avenues were given for businesses and human resource departments, with the cooperation of employers, giving aid in applying for this coverage.

Being an active member of the community and giving great support to the community for healthcare services, State Representative Danny Burgess, gave heartfelt information for helping families in Pasco

County.

"Representative Danny Burgess represents his district well and is a great supporter of community healthcare," Blaasch chatted.

"One of the biggest misconceptions about Florida KidCare is that it is only available to low income families. This program is a great alternative to high cost employer plans, and often has superior coverage and benefits. I would encourage anyone regardless of their household income level, to explore this option before making a final decision on their family's health insurance provider," Rebecca Gaddis chatted with assurance. Gaddis is an employee of San Antonio Citizens Federal Credit Union.

have come to appreciate the various programs for affordable healthcare coverage."

The Florida KidCare program helps to maintain great quality healthcare insurance while keeping the cost affordable and allowing families to have health insurance for children from birth through the age of 18. There is no fee for applying to the program and it has a year round enrollment window.

Doctor visits, vision, hearing and dental care along with other services are included in the Florida KidCare insurance program. It also includes emergency visits.
