

Children's Dental Day

Annually, Premier Community HealthCare serves thousands of children in the Pasco and Hernando communities with quality and compassionate oral



health services. As a commitment to the mission of removing financial barriers to care, Children's Dental Day is held in February, as it relates to Children's Dental Month. In 2021, we served 120 children, of which 81 were new patients to Premier. Each participant received oral health education, a dental kit and a tooth timer. Families were engaged in a fun game of dental BINGO while waiting to be seen.

Mt. Pleasant Missionary Baptist Church

In addition to many other initiatives to eradicate the COVID-19 pandemic, Premier Community HealthCare hosted COVID drive-thru testing sites throughout the community at no cost to patients. In February, Mt.

Supporting Overall Wellness by Expanding Behavioral Health Services

Through CARES Act funding, Premier expanded its Behavioral Health Services in West Pasco County and hired a Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW). This has greatly improved our services by allowing the new social worker to see all patients, whereas previously only the uninsured patients were being seen in Hernando.



Women's Health Day

Our annual Women's Health Day on Monday, May 10, was a great success. These health campaign initiatives aim to introduce Premier's spectrum of affordable care to as many patients as possible and give them the opportunity to receive life-saving screenings. Over 100 women were served across seven clinics in Pasco and Hernando counties with free health screenings and care.

Community Give Back: Our Mission in Action

Philanthropy and community give-back efforts constitute a significant part of the culture at Premier Community HealthCare. Annually, a local charity is selected by our Employee Ambassador Council (EAC) for Premier to partner with and support. In 2021, care team members collected the mostrequested hygiene and care items for those served by Jericho Ministries, Inc. Items included towels, toilet paper, laundry detergent, soap, combs and sanitary napkins for women.



EMPOWERING STUDENTS TO SUCCEED IN SCHOOL AND LIFE

Each day, thousands of Pasco County students arrive to school without access to the same health care opportunities their neighbors and peers may have. Our School-Based Health Centers (SBHCs) and Mobile Dental Program are about raising the floor of basic dental and health care, so these students can freely focus on their days at school.

In alignment with the Premier Community HealthCare mission, barriers to care are removed with on-site services through SBHCs and the Mobile Dental Program. Students and their families can even access muchneeded resources and connections to address financial assistance needs as well as social needs, such as food security and housing.

Through our SBHC partnerships, we can provide affordable, equitable, integrated medical and dental services to elementary school students. Currently, we are partnered with Cox Elementary School (dental) and Gulfside Elementary School (medical and dental).

In tandem, our Mobile Dental Program brings dental care to even more children in need throughout Pasco County.

Cassidy, a six-year-old Pasco County student, had her first-ever dentist appointment on the Premier Mobile Dental Unit. She was excited to hop on the fully equipped 40-ft unit and meet her new dentist, Dr. Lisa Painter, DDS.


The dental team quickly noticed that Cassidy's oral health had been neglected, and she had significant tooth decay at six years old. The myth that rotting baby teeth have no lasting effects on a person is false and, by contrast, can be very harmful to speech development and gum health and permanent teeth that have not erupted yet. The Mobile Dental Care Team provided Cassidy with a full examination, cleaning, and fluoride treatment. The Mobile Dental Program aims to allow families to connect with a dental home and establish healthy oral hygiene habits from a young age.






PATIENT AGES



A STEP TOWARDS HEALTH WITH

PODIATRY CARE

Premier Community HealthCare launched podiatry foot and ankle care in the fall of 2021 with Podiatrist Dr. Bahaa Amer, DPM, DABPM, in Spring Hill and Zephyrhills. Since then, Premier has received over 1,000 referrals and served over 800 patients with podiatry services.

Dr. Amer graduated from Cairo University School of Medicine in Egypt and is board certified. He received his DPM from the New York College of Podiatric Medicine. Dr. Amer is a highly trained physician that treats all aspects of podiatry medicine including, but not limited to, general

podiatry, wound care, forefoot, and rear-foot pathology. He has several publications addressing diabetic foot treatment and other standard foot and ankle disorders.

Maintaining healthy feet is the cornerstone of living well with diabetes. Annually, nearly 70% of lower limb amputations in the United States are due to diabetes complications. Regular examinations allow your podiatrist to assess nerve damage and identify foot health risks.
