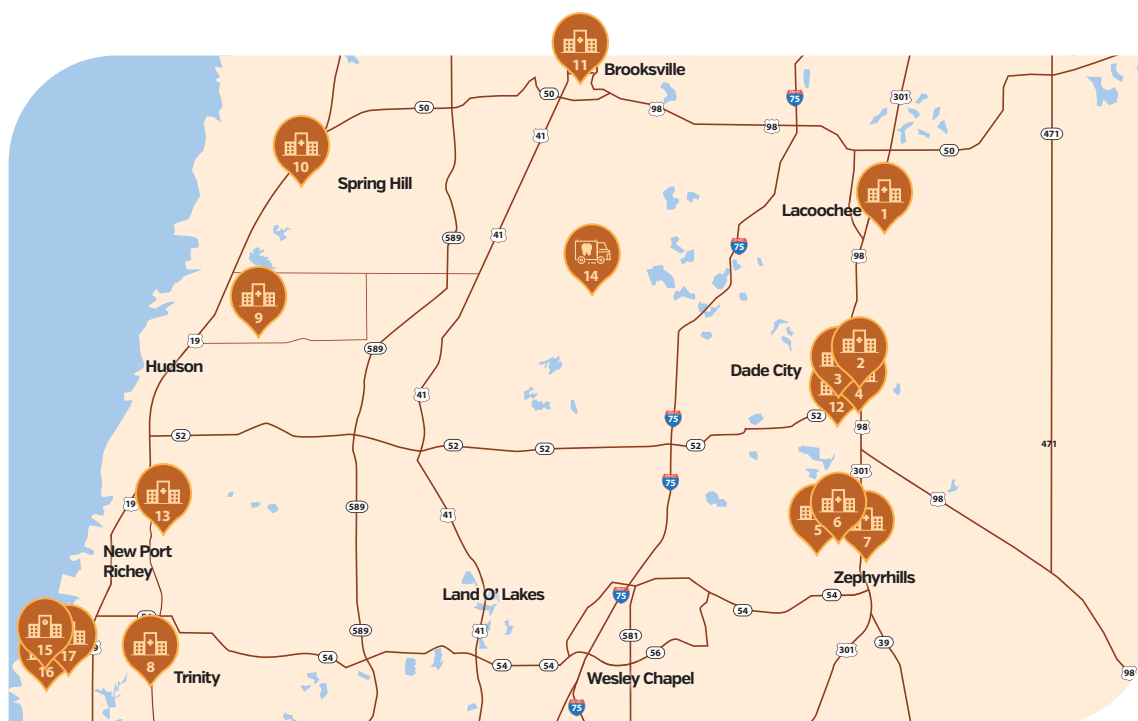

Health, Wellness and Fun Fest

The inaugural Health, Wellness and Fun Fest was held on April 2nd at Cox Elementary School, with the participation of community partners and families. The event provided free health education, screenings, entertainment, activities and refreshments for all ages. The event was attended by a total of 110 people, with 47 adults and 63 children. Of the children attending, 45 received medical screening and 38 received a dental screening with follow-up appointments.

Premier's school-based dental clinic on the Cox Elementary campus serves Pasco County students from Monday to Friday, and it is accepting new patients of all ages.

The event was a successful return to in-person wellness events, and it accomplished its goal of connecting patients to wellness and care inside and outside of the clinic.



Holiday Open House

In December, Premier hosted a festive Holiday Open House at the Pediatric Health Center in New Port Richey. The event welcomed patients, community members, the Board of Directors, staff and donors to come together for a celebratory, holiday-themed evening.

The decorations were delightful and added to the cheerful atmosphere, with colorful lights and festive

displays throughout the center. Attendees enjoyed finger foods, sweet treats and savory snacks.

One of the highlights of the event was the donor appreciation aspect. Premier Community HealthCare recognized the vital contributions of the donors, who help support the organization's mission to provide high-quality healthcare services to those in need and supported the opening and funding of the Pediatric Health Center in summer of 2021.



Annual Give Back

Mammogram Bus

In alignment with Breast Cancer Awareness Month in October, Premier announced a partnership with the Florida Health Department in Pasco County to provide 3D mobile mammography services to the community, sponsored by Mammogram Bus.

Breast cancer is one of the most common cancers among women worldwide, with over 2.3 million new cases diagnosed in 2020. It is also the second leading cause of cancer death in women. However, early detection through regular mammography screenings can increase the chances of successful treatment and survival. The American Cancer Society recommends that women between the ages of 40 and 44 consider beginning annual mammograms, and those age 45 and older should receive mammograms every year.



By partnering with the Florida Health Department, Premier sought to increase access to these vital screening services for uninsured and underinsured women in the community.

Smiles on Wheels: Premier's Mobile Dental Program

The Premier Community HealthCare Mobile Dental Program is an innovative solution to address the lack of access to oral healthcare services in underserved communities. This program brings the dental clinic to schools, churches, camps, events and homeless campgrounds in Pasco and Hernando counties, eliminating the burden of transportation for those it serves.

The Premier Dental Team offers comprehensive dental services to children and community members with minimal disruptions to their daily routine via the massive 30-foot "Smiles on Wheels" unit.

Pediatric oral health is a crucial component of overall health and wellbeing. According to the American Dental Association, tooth decay is the most common chronic childhood disease in the United States. It is estimated that about one in five children ages 5-11 years have at least one untreated decayed tooth. Moreover, children from low-income families are more likely to suffer from tooth decay and other oral health problems due to limited access to dental care.

One young patient who benefited from this program is Sophia, a six-year-old girl who had severe tooth decay, affecting her ability to speak and eat. Sophia's parents were unable to afford dental care and did not have access to a dental clinic. They heard about the Mobile Dental Program and brought Sophia in for treatment. The dental team on the unit was able to provide comprehensive care, including fillings and sealants.

Sophia's story is just one example of how the Mobile Dental Program can make a significant impact on ensuring everyone has access to the care they need to maintain healthy teeth and a healthy smile.

Saving Patients' Lives With Guidance and Care

The story of Maria Johnson is an inspiring example of how community health centers can make a significant impact on people's lives. Maria, who was diagnosed with breast cancer in 2020, faced the scary reality of being uninsured and not having access to affordable healthcare. However, thanks to Premier Community HealthCare, Maria was able to receive the necessary care and resources to become cancer-free by April 2021.

One of the main challenges that many people in the United States face is access to healthcare. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, approximately 27.5 million Americans did not have health insurance in 2018. This lack of access to healthcare can have devastating consequences, such as delaying diagnosis and treatment of serious illnesses like cancer, which can significantly decrease one's chances of survival.

However, community health centers like Premier Community HealthCare provide vital healthcare services to underserved populations, regardless of their ability to pay. These health centers receive funding from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), which helps them provide affordable, high-quality care to low-income, uninsured and underinsured individuals. In Florida alone, there are 52 community health centers serving over 1.6 million patients annually.

Premier Community HealthCare is an excellent example of how community health centers can help people like Maria navigate the complex healthcare system and how these centers can provide people with the resources they need to receive timely and effective care. Premier guided Maria to the breast and cervical program in Pasco County and helped her get on emergency Medicaid, which ultimately saved her life. Furthermore, Maria's story highlights the importance of early detection and regular screenings, such as mammograms, which can significantly increase the chances of successful treatment and survival.

In addition to providing medical care, community health centers like Premier also offer a range of supportive services, such as transportation,

language interpretation and case management, to help patients overcome social and economic barriers to healthcare. These services can be especially beneficial for people who face significant obstacles to accessing care.

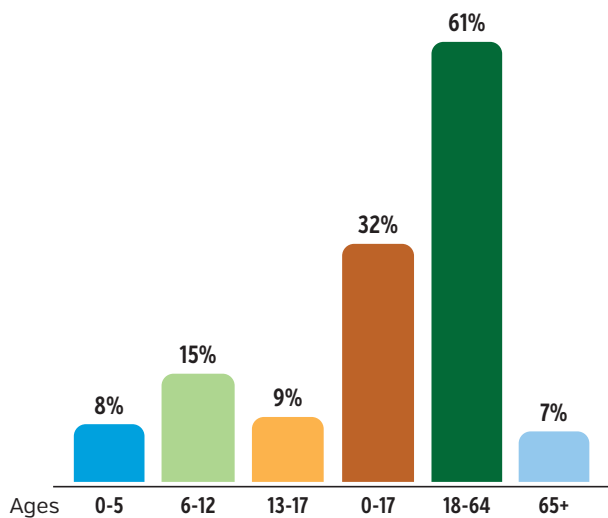

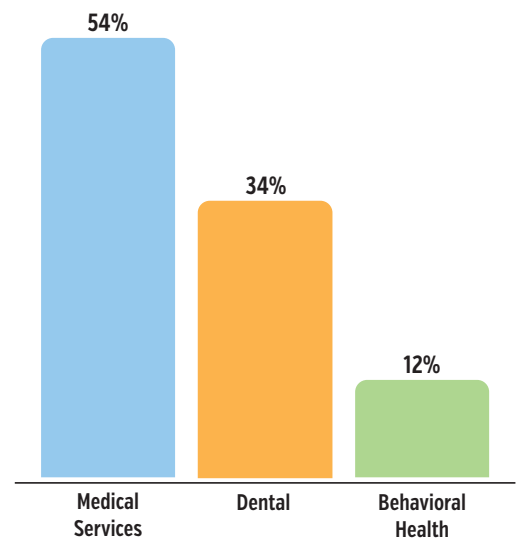

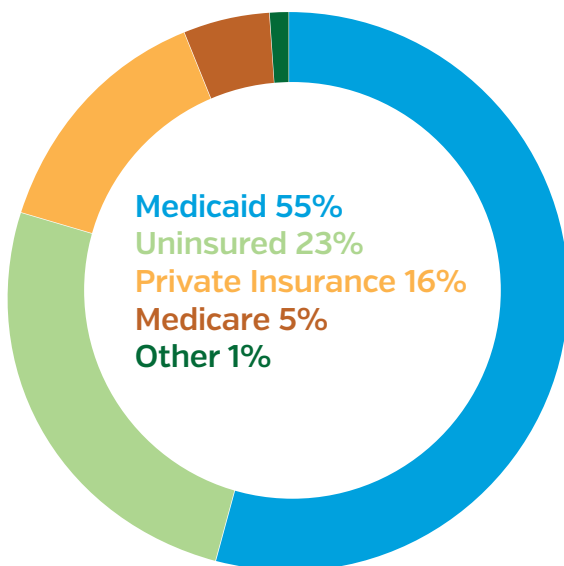
PATIENT AGES

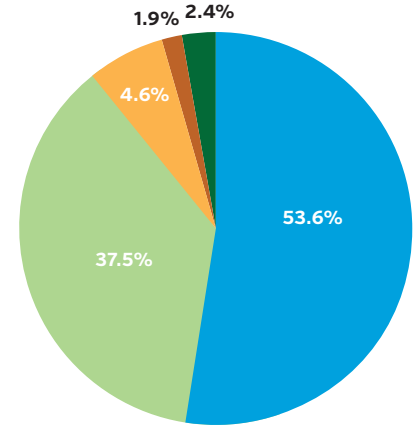

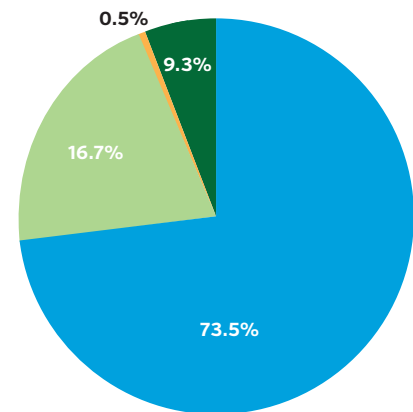

Noteworthy Accolades



Premier achieved a significant milestone by earning three Community Health Quality Recognition [CHQR] badges from the Health Resources and Services Administration [HRSA] in 2022.

HRSA is a federal agency that works to improve access to healthcare for people who are uninsured, medically underserved or vulnerable. These badges are awarded to health centers that have demonstrated outstanding quality improvement achievements in access to healthcare, quality of healthcare, health equity, health information technology and COVID-19 public health emergency response.

One of the badges awarded to Premier is the Access Enhancer badge. This badge recognizes that Premier has improved access to care by implementing innovative approaches to scheduling, patient outreach and care coordination.

The second badge earned by Premier is the Quality Improver badge. This badge recognizes that Premier has made significant improvements in clinical quality measures, resulting in improved patient outcomes and increased patient satisfaction.

The third badge awarded to Premier is the Health Center Quality Leader badge. This badge is awarded to health centers that have demonstrated the highest level of clinical quality performance.

Premier's three CHQR badges are a testament to the dedication and hard work of its healthcare providers, staff and stakeholders. The HRSA recognizes Premier's efforts to increase access to quality healthcare services, reduce health disparities and respond effectively to the COVID-19 pandemic. These badges serve as a reminder of the importance of quality improvement initiatives in healthcare and the critical role that health centers play in providing access to quality healthcare services.

Clinical Advancement & Training

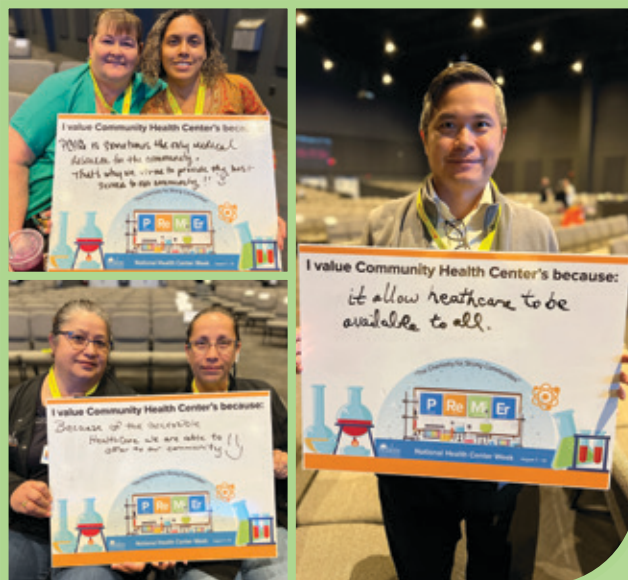


2022 National Health Center Week

She expressed her heartbreak at seeing children with tooth decay at young ages, and stressed the need to protect teeth and gums as they are the gate to the entire body. As someone who has served Dade City residents for over 12 years, Dr. Genho is proud to be part of this growth and access point.

Dr. Signorelli, who is providing dental care at the new center, is also excited about the opportunity to serve the community. She believes that accessible dental services for children are critical to improving overall health outcomes in the area.

The Zephyrhills Pediatric Dental Center is a vital addition to the community. The lack of access to dental care is a

significant issue for many families, especially those with low income or without insurance. This center will provide high-quality dental care to children in East Pasco County, regardless of their ability to pay. Additionally, the center will offer oral health education to promote good dental hygiene and prevent future dental issues.
